SUBJECT: 2003 Infrastructure Systems Conference, 6-8 May 2003, Las Vegas, NV

1. The announcement memorandum for the conference was sent out on 26 April 2002. This is a follow-up to provide additional information. The conference is sponsored by the U. S. Army Corps of Engineers and both the Naval Facilities Engineering Command and the Air Force will be participating. The South Pacific Division and the Los Angeles District are hosting the conference. It will be held at the Bally's Hotel in Las Vegas, Nevada. The conference will consist of a plenary session and break out workshops on security engineering, structural engineering, geotechnical engineering, materials engineering, electrical engineering, mechanical engineering, construction, specifications and dam safety. The conference will have an exhibit area for display booths for participating manufacturers and associations. The theme of the conference is "Engineering in a Changing World". The emphasis will be on engineering safety and security into DoD and civil works facilities. The conference will commence at 0800 hours, Tuesday, 6 May 2003, and continue through 1200 hours, Thursday, 8 May 2003. Thursday afternoon will be available for optional training sessions. On Monday evening, 1700-2000 hours, an ice breaker will take place in the exhibit area. Twenty (20) professional development hours (PDHs) will be provided for those attending the conference and four (4) PDHs for those taking the optional training sessions. Field trips and trips for spouses are also being planned.
