The drainage path out of the watershed is blocked by the west levee of the Coachella Branch of the All-American Canal, owned by the U.S. Bureau of Reclamation. Flow from the watershed is redirected by the levee to a sediment and debris basin. The presence of the levee and the freeboard storage capacity of the terminal reservoir hydrologically separate the reservoir site drainage area from the downstream watershed.
