Dear Mr. Uhley:

Section 1002 of the Water Resources Reform and Development Act (WRRDA) of 2014 requires that a U.S. Army Corps of Engineers District Engineer provide a non-Federal study sponsor with notification of feasibility study schedule dates for key milestones within 90 days of executing a Feasibility Cost Share Agreement (FCSA) and when milestone dates change by more than 30 days. The FCSA for the Murrieta Creek General Reevaluation Report was executed on June 30, 2023.

The dates for the milestones listed below are yet to be determined, consistent with recent communication with your staff. The previously reported dates have been delayed due primarily to vernal pool investigation and updated H&H modeling.


