LOCATION AND DESCRIPTION:

Marina Del Rey Harbor is located in the County of Los Angeles, California, approximately 15 miles southwest of downtown Los Angeles. It is the largest man-made harbor in the United States, with nearly six thousand boat slips.

The harbor provides key support for search and rescue missions and Homeland Security for Los Angeles International Airport.

The harbor is also used for recreational and fishing purposes.

A Coast Guard cutter is permanently stationed in the harbor.

The harbor was initially placed in full operation in April 1965. Federal maintenance responsibilities for the project consist of the entrance channel, main channel, jetties, and the detached breakwater. The project condition is good.
