Requester: In compliance with U.S.C. Title 33, Chapter 9, Subchapter 1, Section 408, the City of Ontario, through the San Bernardino County Flood Control District (SBCFCD) has requested permission from the U.S. Army Corps of Engineers (USACE) to alter the Cucamonga Creek Channel.

Location:

The proposed action would install a 12-inch diameter cement-mortar-lined-and-coated (CML&C) pipeline within an 18 inch diameter welded steel pipe casing onto the north side of the Merrill Avenue Bridge parapet over the Cucamonga Creek Channel in City of Ontario, San Bernardino County, California. The proposed action is to attach the pipeline to the north side of the existing bridge, and construction equipment would operate within the channel.

Requester's Proposed Action:

The City of Ontario is proposing to install, operate, and maintain a crossing of a 12-inch CML&C PVC recycled waterline within an 18-inch steel casing by attaching to the Merrill Avenue Bridge parapet above the Cucamonga Creek Channel. The purpose of the project is to connect the new 12-inch pipeline to an existing 12-inch pipeline in Archibald Avenue and distribute the water to the proposed development of the City's Master Plan of Streets and Highways located at the intersection of Merrill Avenue and Carpenter Avenue.

Authority: The authority to grant permission for temporary or permanent use, occupation or alteration of any USACE Civil Works project is contained in Section 14 of the Rivers and Harbors Act of 1899, as amended, codified at 33 USC 408 ("Section 408"). Section 408 authorizes the Secretary of the Army, on the recommendation of the Chief of Engineers, to grant permission for the alteration or occupation or use of a USACE project if the Secretary determines that the activity will not be injurious to the public interest and will not impair the usefulness of the project. The Secretary of Army's authority under Section 408 has been delegated to the USACE, the Chief of Engineers. The Chief of Engineers has further delegated the authority to the USACE, Directorate of Civil Works and Division and District Engineers, depending upon the nature of the activity.

Limits of Section 408 Authority: A requester has the responsibility to acquire all other permissions or authorizations required by federal, state, and local laws or regulations, including any required permits from the USACE Regulatory Program under Section 10 of the

Rivers and Harbors Act of 1899 (33 USC 403), Section 404 of the Clean Water Act (33 USC Section 1344), and/or Section 103 of the Marine Protection, Research and Sanctuaries Act of 1972 (33 USC 1413). The compliance determination for any Section 10/404/103 permit decision associated with the proposed alteration will also address the Section 408 compliance determination. In addition, an approval under Section 408 does not grant any property rights or exclusive privileges nor does it authorize any injury to the property or rights of others.

Consideration of Comments: The Corps is soliciting comments from the public, Federal, State and local agencies and officials, and other interested parties. Comments will be made part of the record, and they will be considered before permission is granted to proceed with this action. Please limit comments to the area of the alteration and those adjacent areas that would be directly or indirectly affected by the alteration described in this public notice.

Submission of Comments: Interested parties may submit, in writing, any comments concerning this proposal. Comments should reference public notice no. SPL-408-PN-2019-0003 and be forwarded by the comment due date of September 18, 2019.
