Requester: In compliance with U.S.C. Title 33, Chapter 9, Subchapter 1, Section 408, the Nevada Department of Transportation (NDOT), through the Clark County Regional Flood Control District (CCRFCD), has requested permission from the U.S. Army Corps of Engineers (USACE) to alter the Tropicana Outlet Channel and Confluence Structure.

Location:

The proposed action would reconstruct portions of the Tropicana Outlet Channel and Confluence Structure adjacent to interstate highway I-15 between Ali Baba Lane and Tropicana Avenue in the City of Las Vegas, Clark County, Nevada. The proposed features are not inside the channel, and will therefore not require construction within the channel.

Requester's Proposed Action:

The proposed project involves reconstructing approximately 167 meters of the existing channel and confluence structure with reinforced concrete box (RCB) structure. Elements of reconstruction include 20'x7' RCBs, and 8.5'x7' RCBs. The existing structures would not be disturbed either on the interior or on the exterior, but would be replaced in kind at the same location. This would involve excavation to remove the existing concrete lined channels and RCBs, followed by installation of new RCBs at the same locations.

The purpose of the project is to increase traffic capacity and reduce congestion on Tropicana Avenue and freeway ramps, and further improve freeway access by providing High Occupancy Vehicle (HOV) ramps at the Harmon Avenue Overpass.

Authority: The authority to grant permission for temporary or permanent use, occupation or alteration of any USACE Civil Works project is contained in Section 14 of the Rivers and Harbors Act of 1899, as amended, codified at 33 USC 408 ("Section 408"). Section 408 authorizes the Secretary of the Army, on the recommendation of the Chief of Engineers, to grant permission for the alteration or occupation or use of a USACE project if the Secretary determines that the activity will not be injurious to the public interest and will not impair the usefulness of the project. The Secretary of Army's authority under Section 408 has been delegated to the USACE, the Chief of Engineers. The Chief of Engineers has further delegated the authority to the USACE, Directorate of Civil Works and Division and District Engineers, depending upon the nature of the activity.

Limits of Section 408 Authority: A requester has the responsibility to acquire all other permissions or authorizations required by federal, state, and local laws or regulations, including any required permits from the USACE Regulatory Program under Section 10 of the Rivers and Harbors Act of 1899 (33 USC 403), Section 404 of the Clean Water Act (33 USC Section 1344), and/or Section 103 of the Marine Protection, Research and Sanctuaries Act of 1972 (33 USC 1413). In addition, an approval under Section 408 does not grant any property rights or exclusive privileges nor does it authorize any injury to the property or rights of others.

Consideration of Comments: The Corps is soliciting comments from the public, Federal, State and local agencies and officials, and other interested parties. Comments will be made part of the record, and they will be considered before permission is granted to proceed with this action. Please limit comments to the area of the alteration and those adjacent areas that would be directly or indirectly affected by the alteration described in this public notice.

Submission of Comments: Interested parties may submit, in writing, any comments concerning this proposal.
