Dear Mr. Mayo:

Pursuant to your request to Mr. Kendall of this office on 26 May 1965, the following is a list of waters within the State of Utah considered as "navigable waters of the United States" for the purpose of administering the laws enacted by Congress for the protection and preservation of interstate navigation:

1. Bear Lake
2. Lake Ashley (formed by Flaming Gorge Dam)
3. Lake Powell (formed by Glen Canyon Dam)
4. Colorado River from Mile 176 above Lees Ferry to the Arizona-Utah boundary, a distance of about 150 miles (This entire reach is within the impoundment area of Lake Powell.)

It should be understood that the above designated areas represent the views of the Department of Army, since the jurisdiction of the United States can be conclusively determined only through judicial proceedings.
