SUBJECT: Declaration of Lake Perris as a TNW

1. Lake Perris is located in the City of Perris, Riverside County, California. (LAT: 33.864720 LON: -117.1661100). The facilities are owned and operated by The Department of Water Resources (DWR) in cooperation with the Metropolitan Water District of Southern California (MWDSC).
2. Perris Dam and Lake Perris were constructed in 1973 as the southern terminus of the east branch of the California Aqueduct. Water is conveyed to the reservoir from the Feather River and Sacramento River watersheds through the Central Valley by the East Branch of the California Aqueduct of the State Water Project (SWP). The reservoir supplies water to communities throughout southern California for municipal and industrial uses.
3. The three mile long, two mile wide lake holds 125,000 acre feet of water and its ten miles of shoreline supports numerous aquatic recreation activities including swimming, scuba diving, fishing and boating. Facilities include two paved, four-lane boat ramps, 35 overnight slip rentals, 200 monthly wet slip rentals, 70 dry slip rentals as well as a tackle and bait shop. Recreational Activities are expected to continue indefinitely.


